

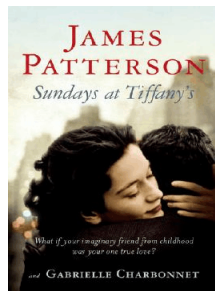


## Great Adult Fiction for Teens

You may have to fight with your parents to see who gets to read these books first!

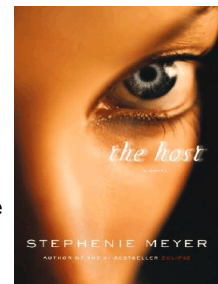
### **Sundays at Tiffany's,** by James Patterson. (2008)

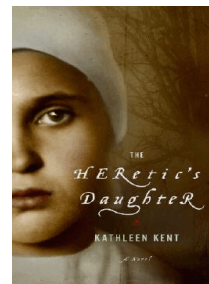


### **The Good Thief,** by Hannah Tinti. (2008)



A 12-year-old one-handed orphan, his long lost brother, and an adventure full of questionable characters make this a spooky story with twists and turns for everyone to enjoy.

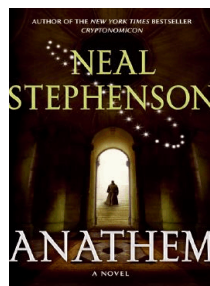
### **The Heretic's Daughter,** by Kathleen Kent. (2008)

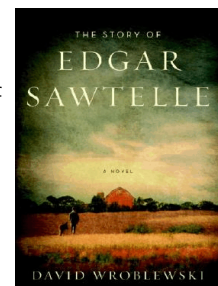
### **Anthem,** by Neal Stephenson. (2008)

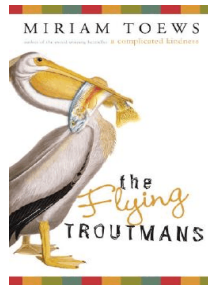

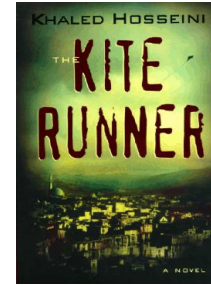
### **The Flying Troutmans,** by Miriam Toews. (2008)

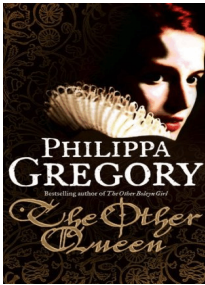


### **The Kite Runner,** by Khaled Hosseini. (2007)

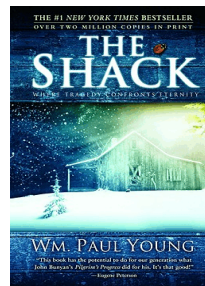


### **The Other Queen,** by Philippa Gregory. (2008)

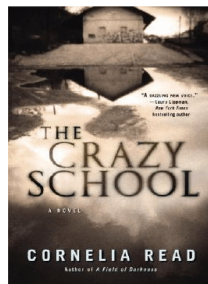
### **The Shack,** by William P. Young. (2007)
